VILLAGE OF NUNDA
LOCAL LAW NO. 3 OF 2026

A Local Law Regulating the Control and Removal of Dog Waste

Section 1. Purpose

The purpose of this local law is to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Village of Nunda; to prevent unsanitary conditions and nuisances; to preserve the cleanliness and usability of public streets, sidewalks, parks, and other public places; and to promote responsible ownership and control of dogs within the Village.

Section 2. Definitions

Dog – Any member of the species *Canis familiaris*.

Owner – Any person who owns, keeps, harbors, or has custody or control of a dog.

Public Property – Any street, sidewalk, highway, park, recreation area, public building grounds, or other property owned or maintained by the Village of Nunda or open to the general public.

Private Property – Any property not owned by the person in control of the dog.

Section 3. Prohibited Conduct

A. No owner shall cause, suffer, permit, or allow any dog owned, harbored, or controlled by such person to soil, defile, defecate, or commit any nuisance upon:

1. Any public property within the Village;
2. Any private property without the consent of the owner or occupant of such property.

B. The provisions of this section shall not apply to guide dogs accompanying a blind person, service dogs accompanying a person with a disability, or police dogs engaged in official duties.

Section 4. Immediate Removal Required

Any owner whose dog defecates upon any public or private property, other than property owned or occupied by the owner, shall immediately remove all feces deposited by such dog and dispose of the same in a sanitary manner.

Removal shall mean the collection and lawful disposal of the fecal matter in a closed container or other approved receptacle so as to prevent unsanitary conditions or offensive odors.

Section 5. Nuisance Declared

Failure to remove dog feces as required by this local law is hereby declared to constitute a public nuisance and a violation of this local law.

Section 6. Enforcement

This local law shall be enforced by the Village of Nunda Police Department.

Members of the Village Police Department are authorized to issue appearance tickets pursuant to the Criminal Procedure Law for violations of this local law.

Nothing herein shall limit the authority of the Village to pursue any other remedy available at law or in equity.

Section 7. Penalties

Any person who violates any provision of this local law shall be guilty of a violation and, upon conviction thereof, shall be subject to:

- A fine not exceeding \$50 for a first offense;
- A fine not exceeding \$100 for a second offense within five (5) years;
- A fine not exceeding \$250 or imprisonment for a period not exceeding fifteen (15) days, or both, for a third or subsequent offense within five (5) years.

Each separate incident shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 8. Severability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law shall be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof.

Section 9. Effective Date

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.
